## Village Green Status

Our Village Green has been granted protected Village Green Status. This means that the Green must remain as a Village Green in perpetuity and cannot be built on. We are in the process of preparing a plinth to commemorate the award which will be unveiled at a special ceremony on **Sunday March 1<sup>st</sup>**. It will be a short ceremony at 11am, with local Councillors and dignitaries present, followed by refreshments in the Church Hall. All are welcome and we hope you will come and support the occasion. We are one of only 5 Village Greens that have been awarded this status.

## CAMPANOLOGY (BELL RINGING)

We hope many of you enjoyed the wonderful peal of the St John's Church Bells on Sunday afternoon 18<sup>th</sup> January.



A visiting group of campanologists rang a full peal consisting of 5040 changes. A full peal is rung entirely from memory with the same band of ringers throughout. An amazing feat. Our thanks go to the group on the completion of the full peal.

Campanology, the study and art of bell ringing began with small handbells before moving to bells in church towers. They were used for calling worshipers to services, marking curfews, and signalling events from around the 8<sup>th</sup> century. The modern practice of complex patterned 'change ringing' developed in 17<sup>th</sup> century England. It was codified by figures like Fabian Stedman, transforming bell

ringing from simple chiming into a mathematical, musical art form involving full rotations of bells. It thrives today as a distinct English tradition. The first documented peal, (a long, continuous performance of thousands of changes), occurred in 1715 in Norwich, England. The art has spread internationally, with new towers being installed in various countries, and the Belgian carillon tradition is recognized by UNESCO.

### WOULD YOU LIKE TO TEST OUT BELL RINGING?
